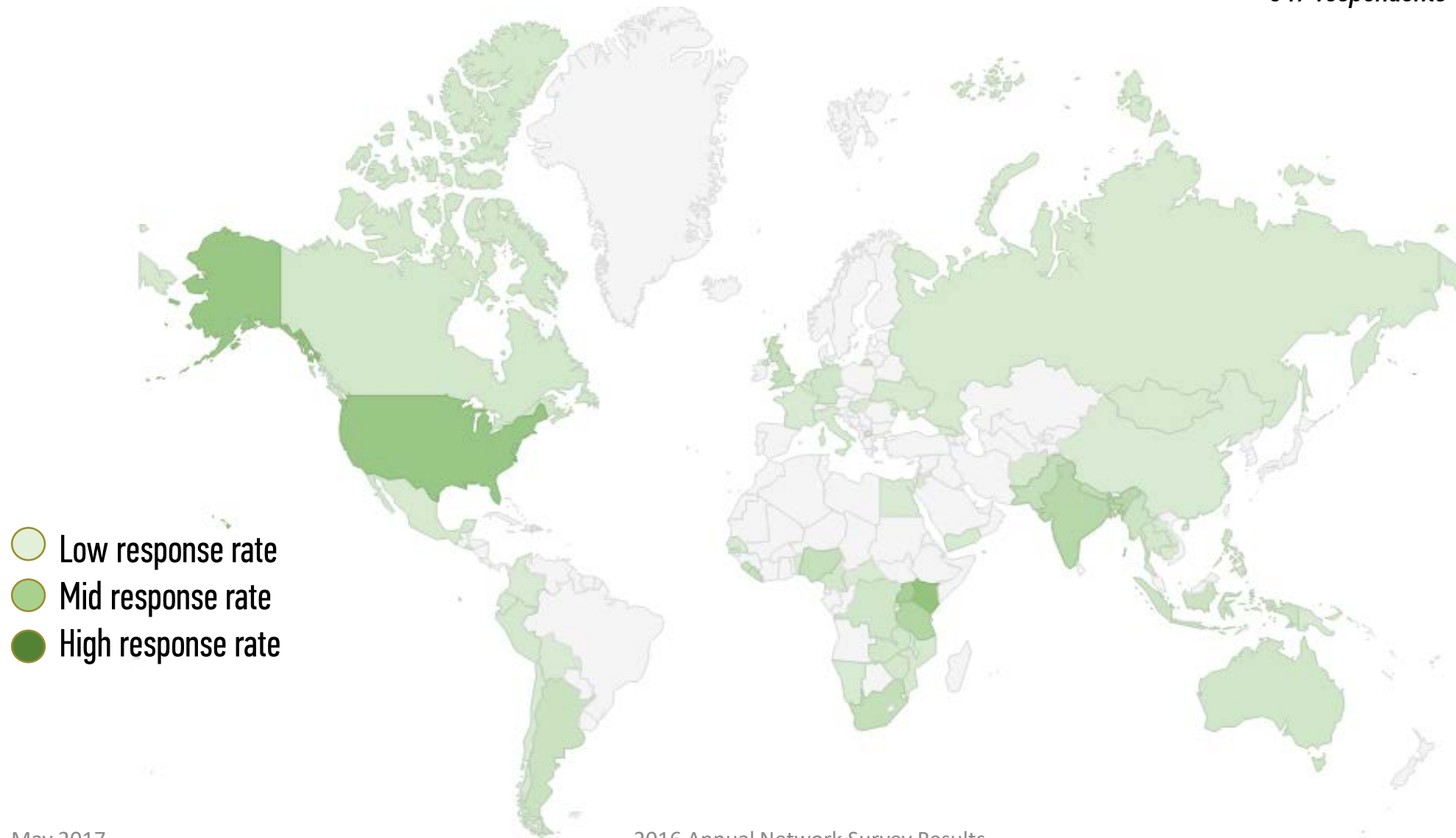


2016 Annual Network Survey Results

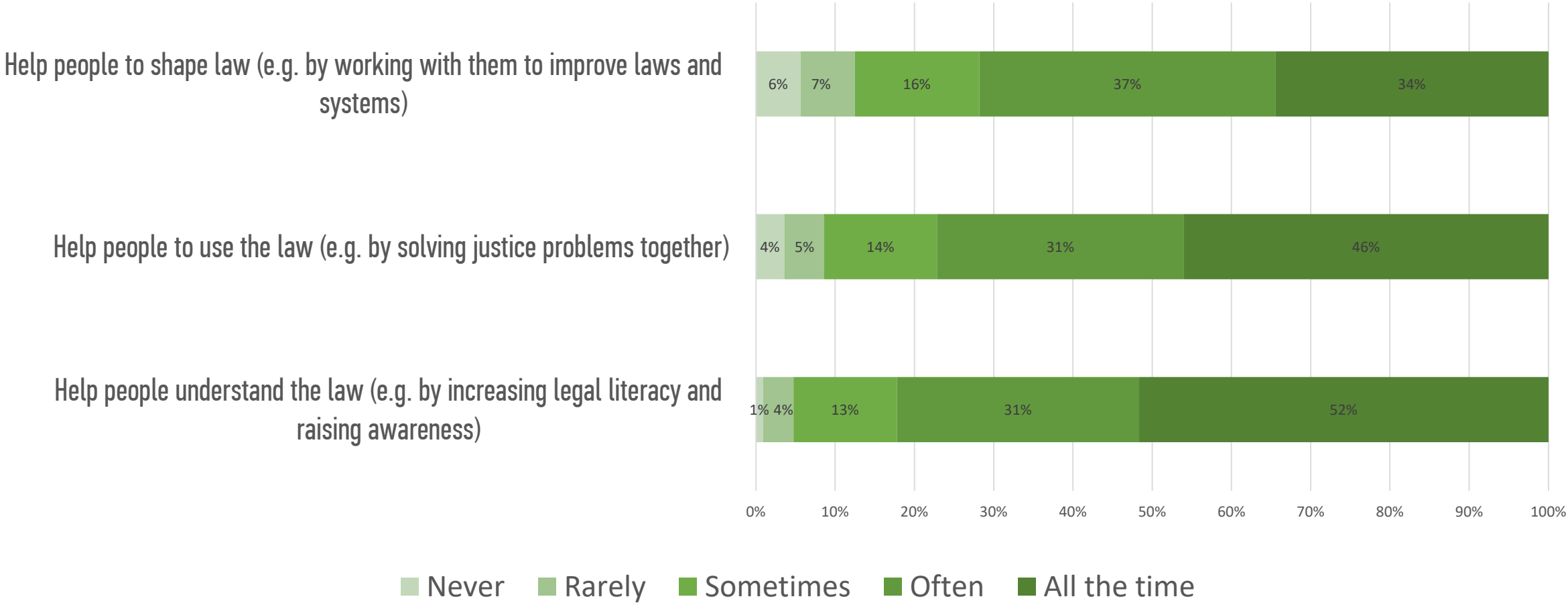
Responses by Country

347 respondents

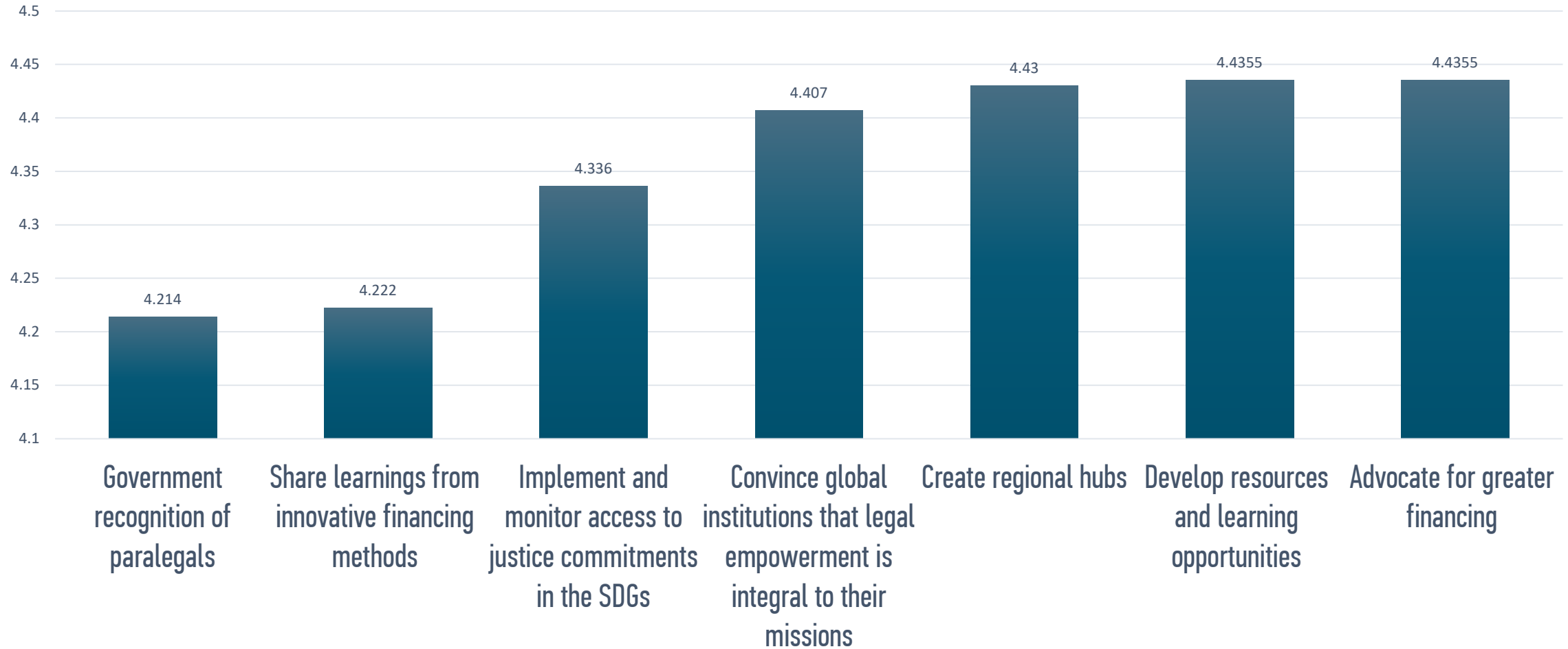


- Low response rate

What do you think should be the most important priorities for the Global Legal Empowerment Network next year?

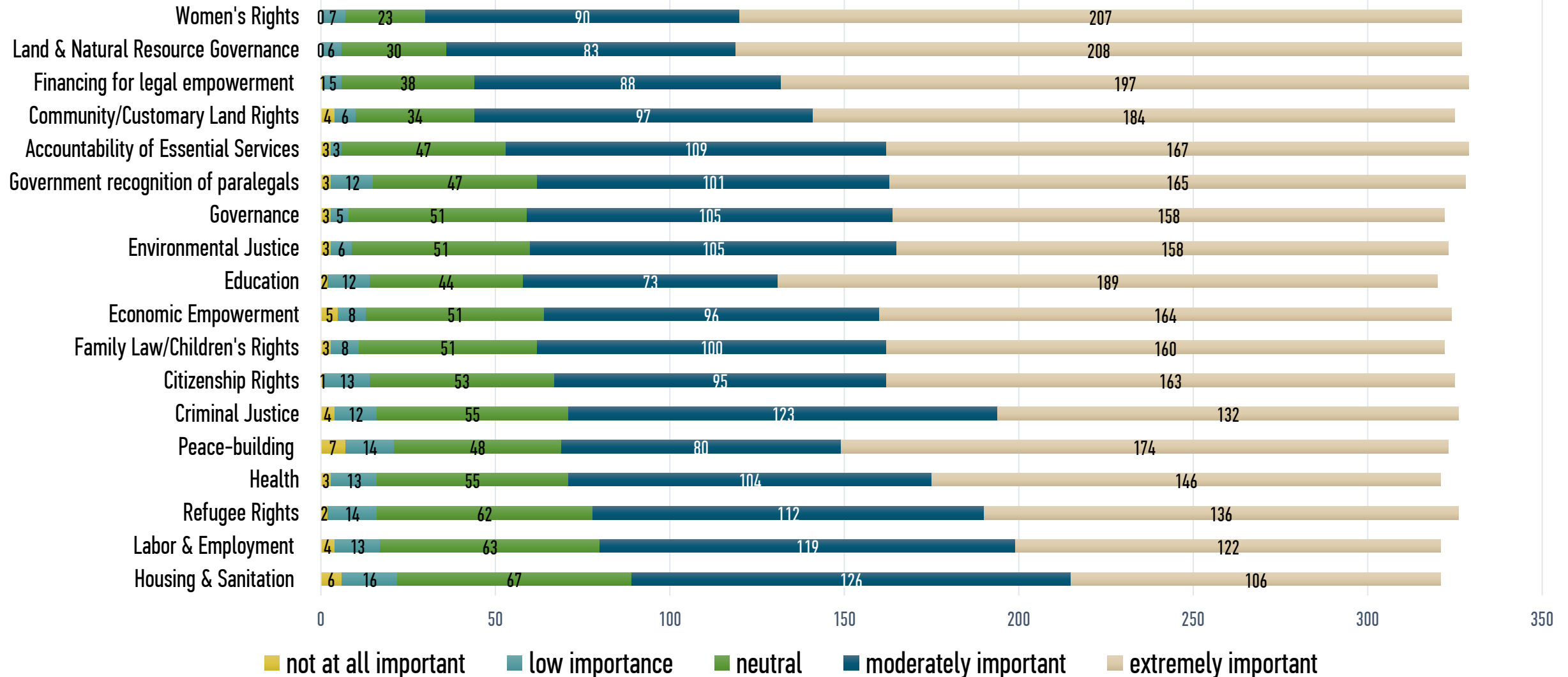


■ Average score on a 1-5 scale, with 5 being the highest

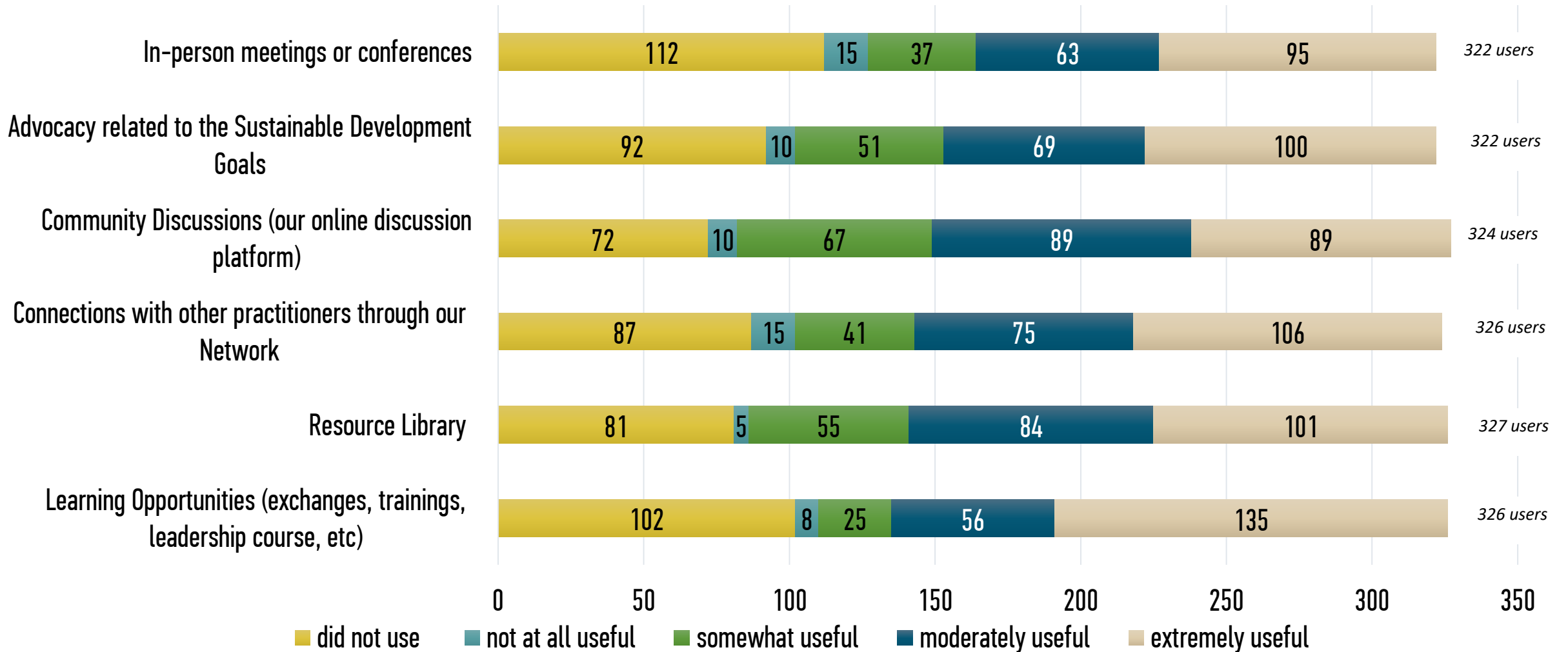
If the network campaigns on one of these issues, what tactics would you be most interested in taking part in?

How useful have the following Global Network activities been to you?



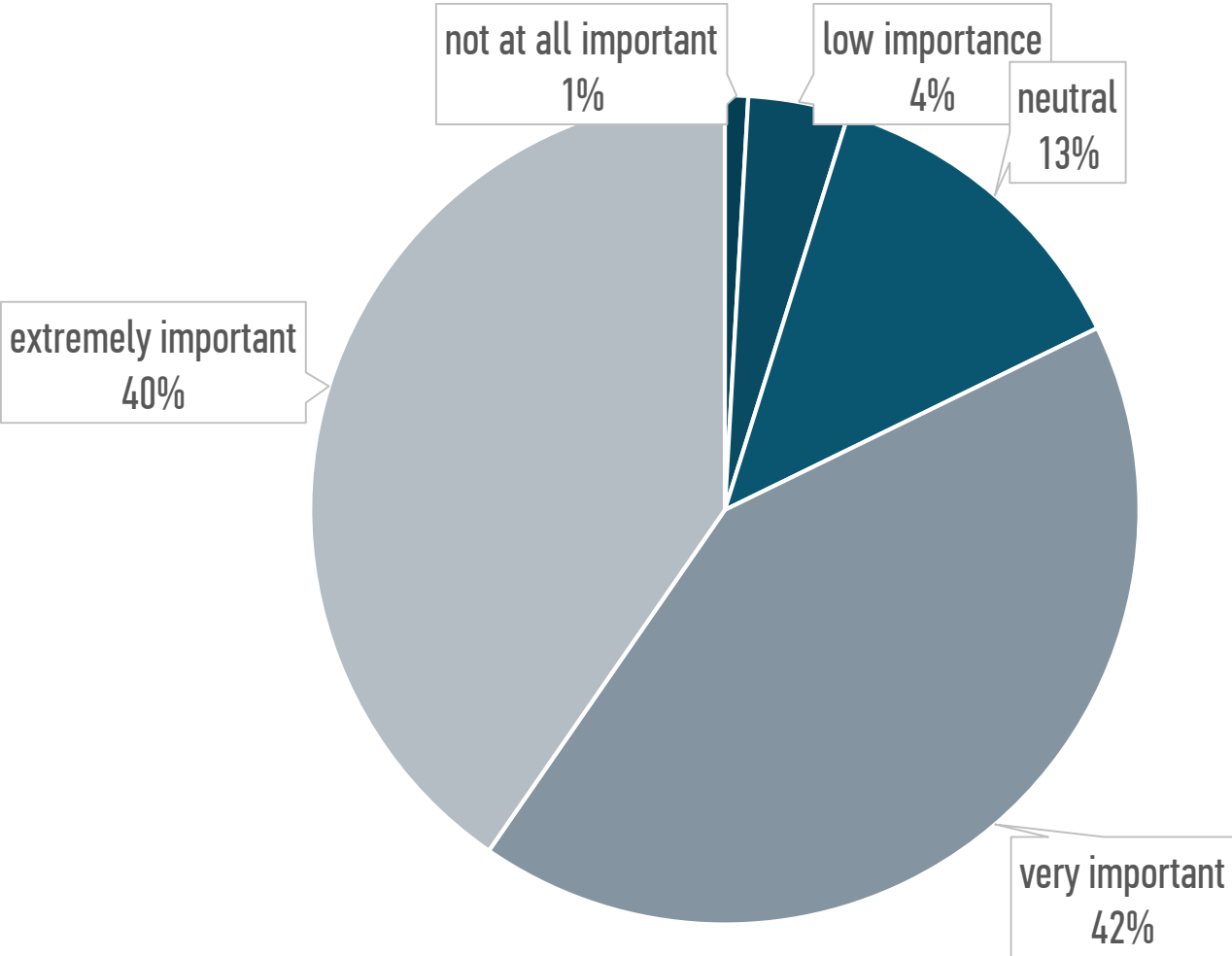
How has the Network helped you in the past year?

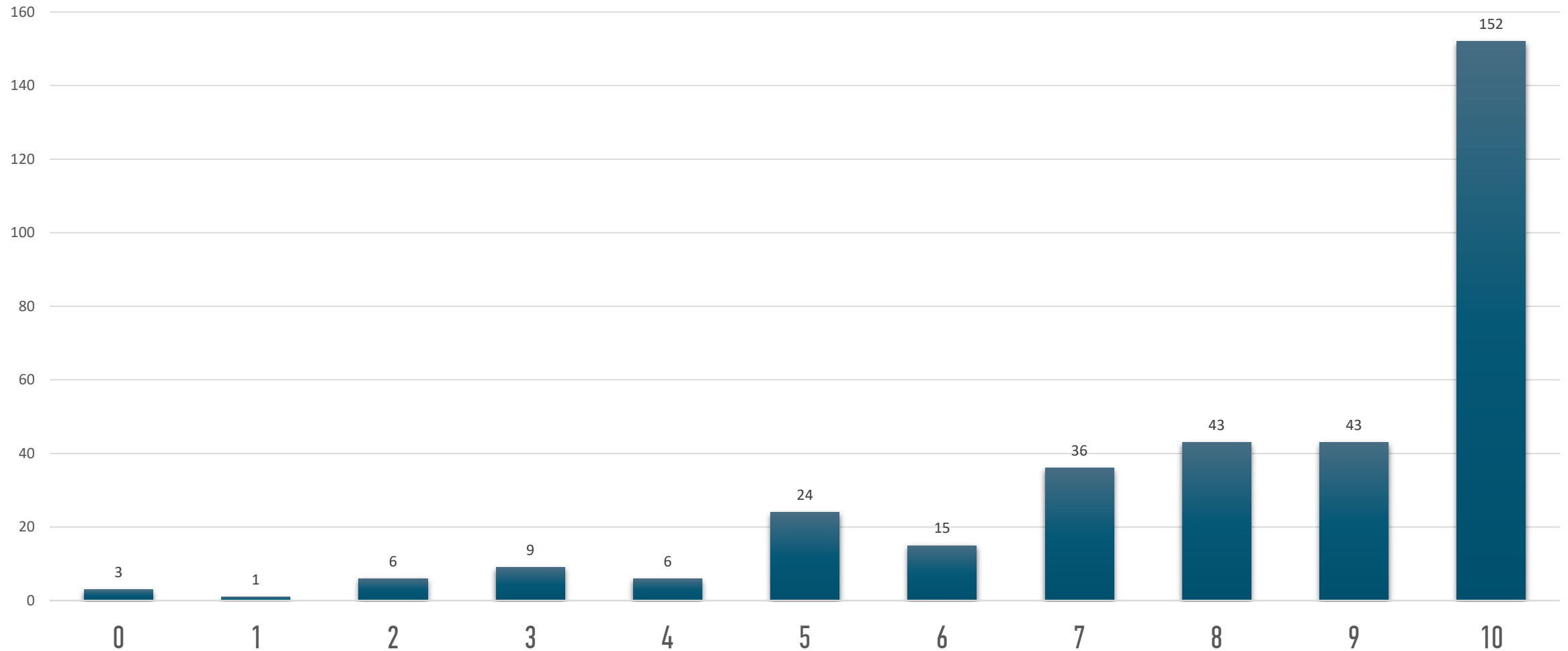
“It has created a pedestal and opportunity to learn how women and other vulnerable groups around the globe need legal assistance in peculiar facets like land.”

“The online group of paralegals and other like-minded organizations is very useful since I get relevant and practical feedback from comrades in real time.”

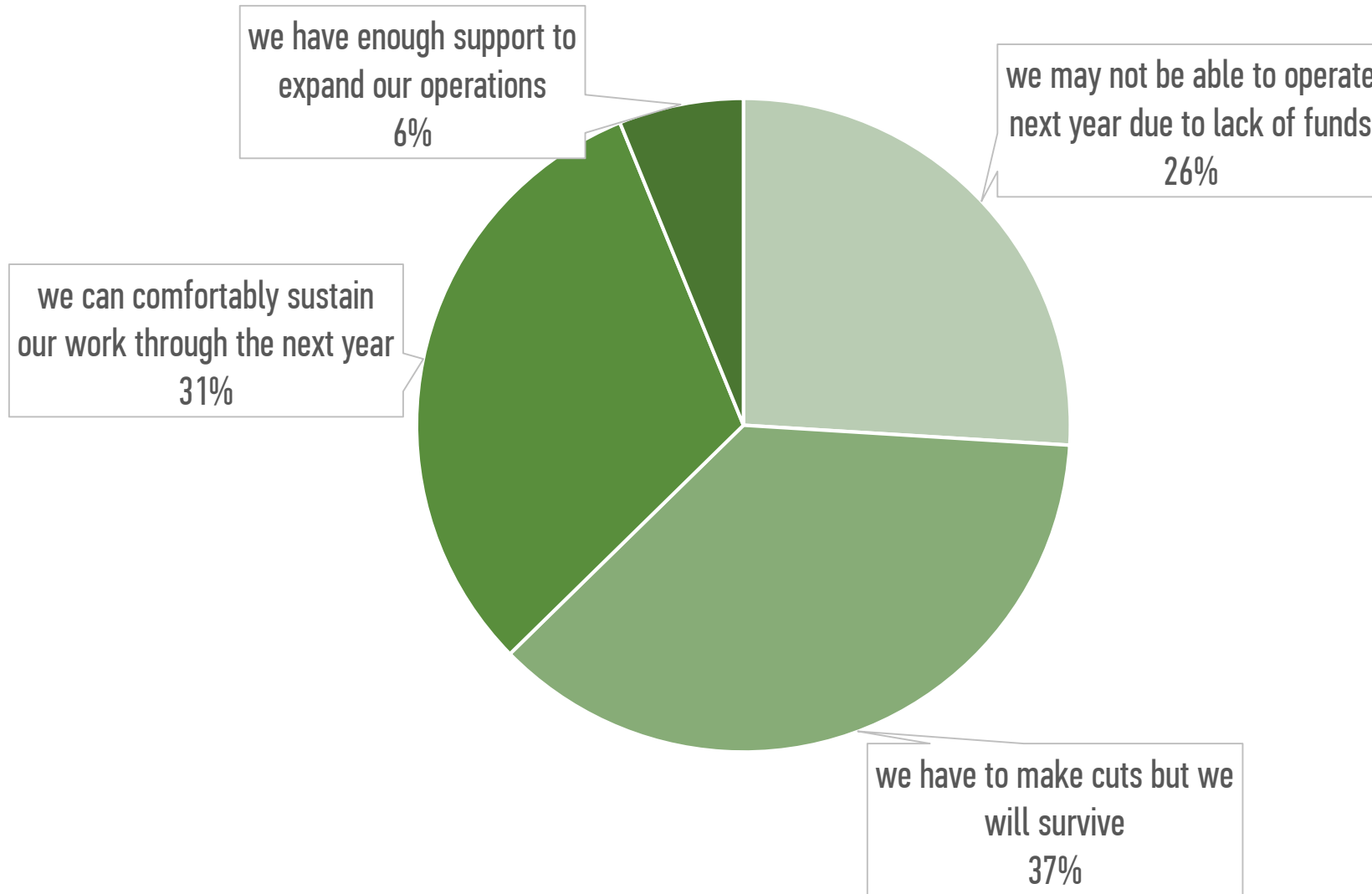
How important is it to you to feel a sense of community with other members of our global network?



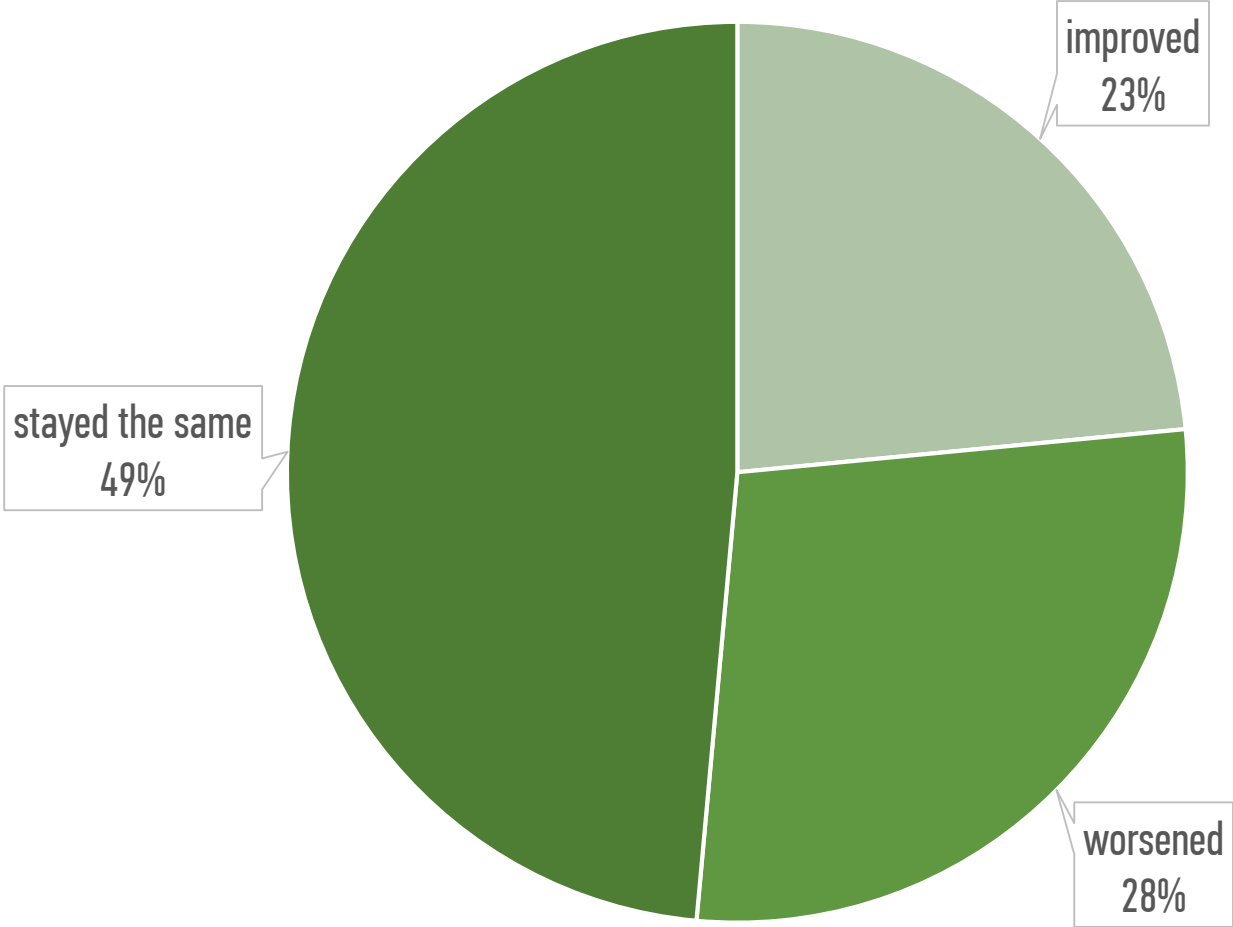
How likely are you to recommend the Global Legal Empowerment Network to a friend or colleague?



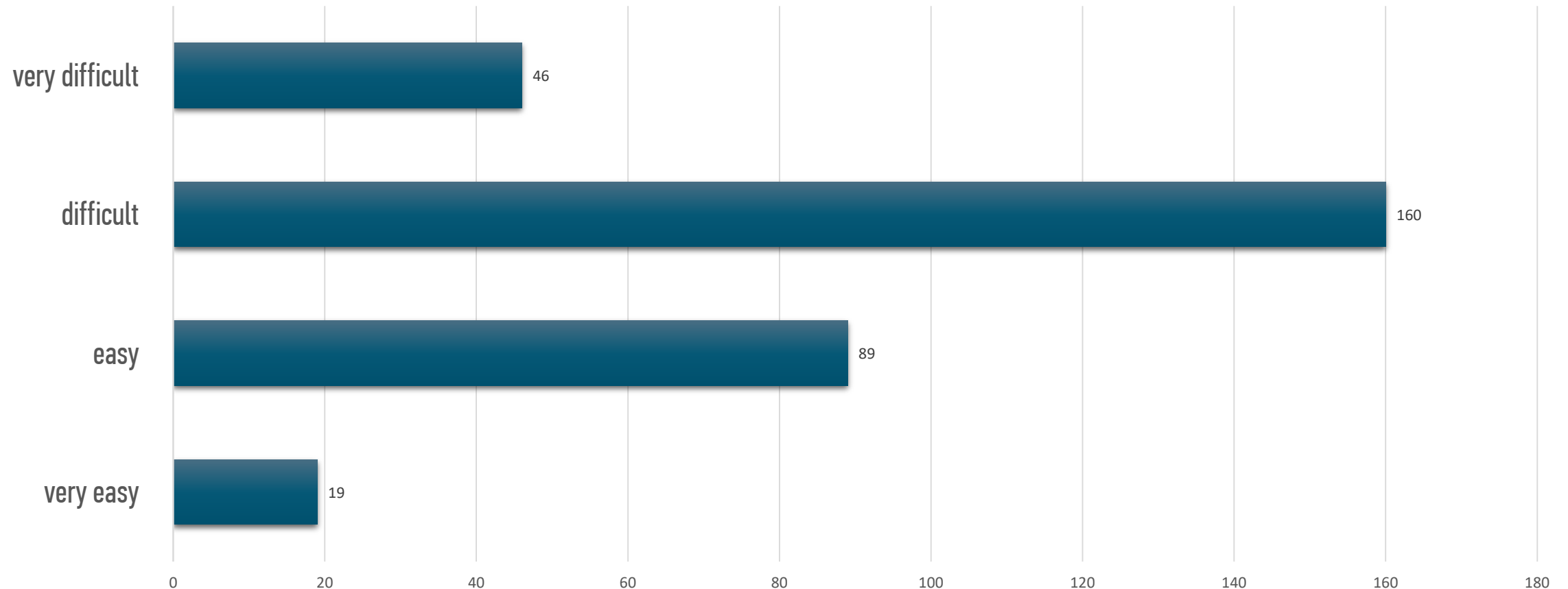
How sustainable is your funding for the year?



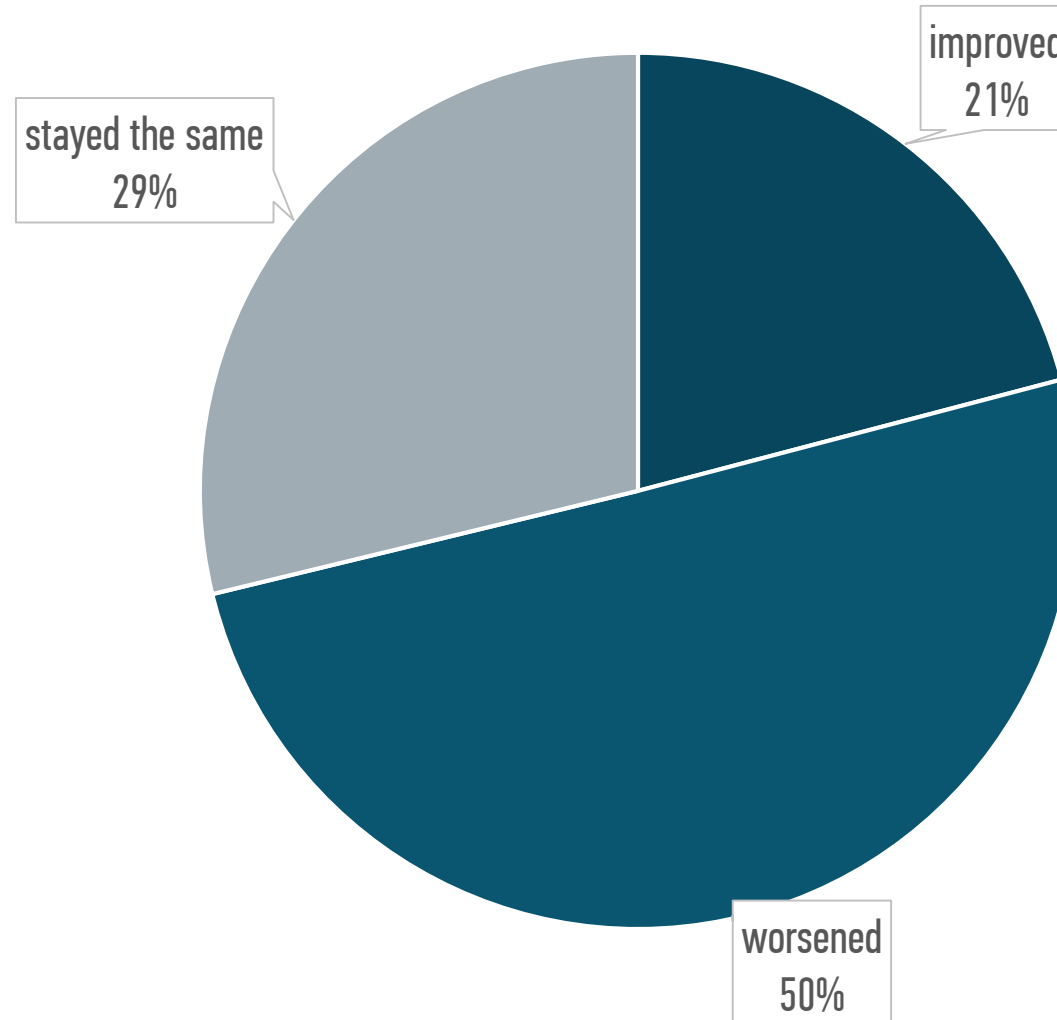
Has your funding situation improved, worsened, or stayed the same in comparison to last year?
